Cape Town	South Africa	CPT-008	Highlights	SUNDOWNERS ON SIGNAL HILL	\$185	2	EASY	Experience breathtaking vistas and photo opportunities over Cape Town during this brief yet memorable sunset visit to Signal Hill. Begin with a drive along historic Kloof Neck Road toward Signal Hill, a flat-topped promontory that rises from the heart of Cape Town near imposing Table Mountain and the distinctive Lion's Head rock outcropping. You'll learn the picturesque hill is renowned for its noon gun and offers a spectacular perspective of Cape Town and the surrounding area, especially at first light and as the sun dips into the Atlantic Ocean. Upon arriving at a perfectly placed vantage point on the summit, take in magnificent sunset views over Table Bay and Cape Town, and relish a selection of canapés and a glass of sparkling wine, an ideal complement to the marvellous setting. Back on your coach, you'll drive past the appealing shoreside neighbourhoods of Camps Bay, Clifton, Bantry Bay, Sea Point and Green Point, a lovely glimpse into the way of life in fascinating Cape Town. Cape Town	South Africa	CPT-014	Highlights	CAPE TOWN AND TABLE MOUNTAIN	\$189	3.5	MODERATE	Embrace the beauty of Cape Town during this scenic trip up Table Mountain, the city's most celebrated landmark. Drive up Kloof Nek Road to the Lower Cableway Station, where you'll board a Swiss-engineered cable car and ascend from the 1,190-foot Valley Station to the 3,477-foot Mountain Station. During the approximately four-minute journey, rejoice in sweeping views as the floor of the car rotates 360 degrees. You'll learn that Table Mountain, named after its flat-topped central massif, is flanked by Devil's Peak and Lion's Head with Signal Hill in the foreground. Notice these outcroppings form a sort of amphitheatre that encloses the city centre and then joins a chain of mountains that runs like a spine through the Cape Peninsula from Table Mountain to Cape Point, from which Cape Town derives its name. You'll discover the protected landscape extending to Cape Point is a UNESCO World Heritage site and home to one of the highest concentrations of endemic flora and fauna in any area of its size, with an impressive 2,285 plant varieties, more than those of the entire United Kingdom combined. Upon your descent, conclude your invigorating visit with a panoramic orientation tour of utterly captivating Cape Town.	This tour involves a substantial amount of walking/standing. Although Table Mountain is wheelchair friendly, the touring vehicle is not. Relax during a leisurely drive to the Stellenbosch Valley, a broad, fertile dale on the Eerste River named after its founder, Governor Simon van der Stel, who discovered it in 1680. You'll learn that today Stellenbosch is a major university town characterized by typical Afrikaner Cape Dutch architecture and streets lined with ancient oak trees, some of which have been declared National Monuments. Enjoy an orientation drive through Stellenbosch followed by approximately one hour at your leisure to explore the town independently and browse a wide selection of curio shops. You might visit the Stellenbosch Museum, which is comprised of four restored houses depicting different eras, the 1709 Schreuder House, the 1788 Bletterman House, the early-19th-century Grosvenor House and the 1850 O.M. Bergh House. Continue to one of the area's acclaimed wine estates, where you'll learn about the well-honed skills employed in the cellar and be invited to participate in a tasting. Settle in for a scenic drive north along the coast toward Bloubergstrand, where you'll stop for photos of the breathtaking views across Table Bay to Cape Town and Table Mountain. Continue to the Cape Town Ostrich Ranch and embark on a guided tour that introduces you to the habits, breeding and characteristics of this unique bird. You'll journey to the exclusive Belmond Mount Nelson, a beloved Cape Town landmark now over a century old. Find the hotel in the very heart of Old Cape Town, amid nine acres of luxuriant, park-like gardens on a historic site at the foot of Table Mountain. You'll learn the property opened its doors on March 6, 1899, and was the brainchild of shipping magnate Sir Donald Currie, who envisioned a counterpart to the finest hotels in London, then the world's capital of upscale hostelry. Discover he was soon gratified with reviews that heaped praise on his enterprise, which surpassed all expectations and even exceeded comparisons with its British rivals. After settling into the hotel's salon or conservatory, you'll be treated to a tantalizing array of delicate sandwiches and savouries, tempting cakes, pastries and scones, all accompanied by a variety of teas and coffees. As a relaxing finish to your tour, you'll return to the ship through some of Cape Town's most picturesque neighbourhoods while skirting the Atlantic coastline of this dazzling city. You'll learn that for over four centuries, Robben Island was a place of punishment for exiles and criminals as well as a place of confinement for lepers, lunatics and the sick, and from 1960 was used by the apartheid regime to isolate political prisoners such as Mandela. Discover that the last of the political inmates was released in 1991 and the site subsequently opened to the public as the Robben Island Museum, with many of the former political prisoners becoming guides. After a pleasant ferry ride with Cape Town and Table Mountain as your backdrop, arrive at Robben Island and board a bus for a 45-minute orientation drive, seeing the old leper colony, a Muslim shrine and a shipwreck before visiting the limestone quarry where political inmates performed backbreaking labour. Embark on an approximately 45-minute walking tour through the maximum-security block and cherish an opportunity to look into Mandela's compact former cell. As you return to the mainland by ferry, let your thoughts linger on this stirring and uplifting sojourn. After an introductory video that describes the plight of South African cheetahs, you will tour the Cheetah Outreach facility. Its goal is to care for cheetahs, reduce their interaction with humans and help farmers protect their livestock from cheetahs and other predators. Besides having the opportunity to one of these magnificent creatures, you may interact with an Anatolian Shepherd, a dog traditionally used to guard farm animals. A wine tasting follows at Morgenster Estate in the foothills of Helderberg Mountain. Although known for producing extraordinary wines, including Italian varieties such as Nebbiolo, the estate also makes outstanding olive oil. You can expect to sample several extra-virgin olive oils that may include a particularly intense one extracted from a patented variety of olives that Morgenster has the sole right to cultivate. Continuing on along the Atlantic Seaboard, you will pass beautiful Hout Bay while pausing on occasion at lookouts such as the ones above Maiden's Cove and the laidback seaside town Noordhoek. Upon arriving at the Shimansky Rockwell Diamond Experience, you will gain insight into Israeli Yair Shimansky and how he became one of the most acclaimed and innovative diamond jewelers in South Africa. While browsing the exquisite showroom, you will see firsthand how the diamonds are cut and polished to realise their full potential. It is a fascinating process that honours the country's rich history in the diamond trade. While there, you will also be treated to a tasting of premium craft spirits and wine in the lounge. Although the Cape Town area is renowned for wine, perhaps most notably Sauvignon Blanc, local spirits are becoming more popular than ever. Only plants indigenous to South Africa grow there and the thousands of species are grouped by common characteristics. Medicinal plants are clustered together, another sub-garden is devoted to plants from the Western Cape and shade-loving plants are featured in the Dell. You will then follow the Southern Hemisphere's oldest wine route into the suburb of Constantia for a sampling of its characteristic wines. Wineries thrive in the surrounding fertile valley, and you will discover much about their histories while savouring reds and whites that best represent the terroir. Afterwards, you will see a different side of the gorgeous countryside by travelling through Hout Bay and Camps Bay. First and foremost is the Castle of Good Hope, a 17th-century star-shaped fort that is the oldest building in town. While touring the Dutch-built castle, you will also have time to browse the on-site military museum and the period furnishings displayed in the esteemed William Fehr Collection. Continuing on to bustling Adderley Street, you will view architectural treasures such as the Victorian-era Standard Bank Building and the imposing Gothic-style St. George's Anglican Cathedral. Enjoy an enlightening drive around Mossel Bay, a beach-blessed city in the shadow of the Outeniqua Mountains that was named by a Dutch explorer in 1601, when he found a huge collection of mussel shells in a nearby cave. As you travel along the town's charming streets, you'll learn that South Africa's first post office was established here centuries ago after sailors began leaving letters in the cleft of a milkwood tree so that other sailors could deliver them on their journeys. See that revered, 500-year-old tree, now a National Monument, standing near the Bartolomeu Dias Museum Complex, which is named for a Portuguese navigator who was the first European to set foot in South Africa in his search for a spice route to the Far East. During your time at the complex, perhaps you'll visit the absorbing Shell Museum or the Maritime Museum, where a replica of Dias' ship is on exhibit, along with early maps and navigation instruments. Experience the compelling sites and seafaring history of enchanting Mossel Bay on this captivating excursion.	This tour includes approximately one hour of easy walking. There are a few steps to negotiate and ramps are available. The tour is available to guests who utilise a collapsible wheelchair, are able to make their own way on and off the coach and have an able-bodied companion to assist them. Revel in a leisurely drive inland to the beautiful Botlierskop Private Game Reserve, an area of immense biodiversity, where the variety of plants and ecosystems attract more than 200 species of birds but where the larger creatures, such as elephants, lions and giraffe, are the true attractions. Following a welcome drink at the reserve's visitor centre, you'll board an open 4x4 vehicle and drive deep into the fascinating landscape. Discover that the animals wander freely, so there is no telling what you'll see over the next two hours, but it's likely you'll experience close encounters with a variety of indigenous creatures that may include white rhinos, mountain zebras, blue wildebeest, impalas and lions. Thanks to the ideal viewing conditions offered by your 4x4 vehicle, you might also spot smaller yet still delightful animals such as honey badgers, porcupines and rock hyrax, all adding to the magic of your foray into the South African wilds. You'll travel eastward along the magnificent Garden Route, passing ancient forests, golden beaches and craggy peaks covered in a flowering scrub called fynbos. Traverse the stunningly gorgeous scenery of the Wilderness Lakes region and arrive at the charming town of Knysna, tucked between the Outeniqua Mountains and the Indian Ocean. You'll realise forest-rimmed Knysna is a natural paradise whose name is thought to mean "place of wood" in Khoisan, the language of the area's earliest inhabitants. Admire the cosmopolitan town, which has retained much of its original charm, and savour free time at the waterfront, where myriad shops and galleries invite you to browse for high-end crafts and restaurants entice you to try local delicacies. Because of Knysna's proximity to several estuaries, rivers and the ocean, you'll discover that seafood is a favourite, especially dishes with oysters. As you meander the inviting waterfront, looking out over the serene tidal lagoon, let the exquisite atmosphere of Knysna seep into your soul. Mossel Bay	South Africa	MOB-004	Highlights	SCENIC MOUNTAIN PASSES	\$149	4.5	EASY	Cut through the majestic Outeniqua Mountains, taking in sublimely beautiful semi-desert terrain and fertile valleys, on this vista-filled tour. Settle in for a relaxing drive east along the magnificent Garden Route, passing ancient forests, golden beaches and craggy peaks covered in a flowering scrub called fynbos. Upon reaching the town of George, established in the early 1800s as a timbering outpost, you'll turn inland into the Outeniqua Mountains and notice the terrain quickly change from rugged coastal to an arid, desert-like landscape known as Karoo. Cross the Outeniqua Pass along a highway that was painstakingly blasted out of nearly impenetrable bedrock and wind along marvellous, sweeping curves that offer panoramic views in all directions. You'll learn the history of the pass, which was named after the indigenous people that once lived here, then arrive in the town of Oudtshoorn, set in an oasis-like location within a fertile valley. Behold the town's elaborate architecture, which reflects the opulence engendered by the ostrich-feather boom of 1860-1914, when Oudtshoorn supplied exotic feathers to adorn the clothing of ladies throughout Europe. You'll enjoy a brief stop for refreshments before making your way back to Mossel Bay through glorious Robynson Pass.	This tour is primarily panoramic in nature with limited walking at the stops.
