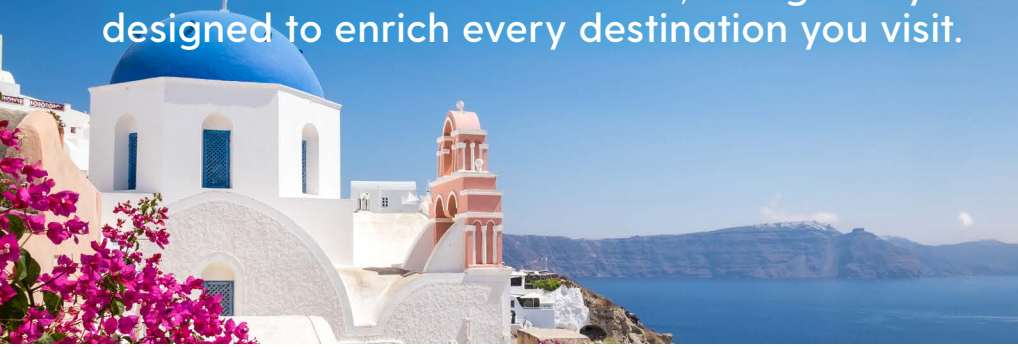

Inside equally massive Saint Peter’s Basilica, you will behold the high altar where the pope celebrates Mass, the splendid gilt-and bronze throne in the apse and the stirring Pietà, one of Michelangelo’s most revered works. A panoramic drive will bring you to the summit of Aventine Hill, from which you can see the remains of Roman imperial palaces and the Circus Maximus, where chariot races were once held, much like those depicted in the movie “Ben Hur.” In central Rome, you will enjoy an interior visit of the iconic Colosseum. Upon arrival in the Eternal City, enjoy approximately 2 ½ hours to shop, sightsee and lunch on your own before travelling to the transcendent Vatican.</p> <p>Embark on your tour at the Bronze Gate, which boasts outstanding Bernini sculptures, and visit the exquisite Vatican Museums and Saint Peter's Basilica, including some private sections. Delight in access to, the Niccoline Chapel, which is adorned with extraordinary 15th-century frescoes by Fra Angelico. Marvel at the ingenious double-helix Bramante Staircase, which allows people to ascend without meeting those descending. Upon arrival in the Eternal City, you'll enjoy a panoramic drive past the Baths of Caracalla's ruins, Capitoline Hill, Piazza Venezia and the Colosseum. During your guided walking tour of the Jewish Quarter, stroll along lively Via Portico d'Ottavia, built in 146 BC and to this day the centre of Jewish life in Rome. As you meander through the winding streets of the village, you will get a great sense of history as this area was once the stronghold of the Etruscans. Known for its ancient necropolis and medieval architecture such as the palazzo that now holds the Etruscan National Museum, hilltop Tarquinia also offers extraordinary views of the Tyrrhenian Sea. One of the largest, clearest bodies of water in the region, Lake Bracciano is volcanically formed unlike the glacial lakes to the north. A natural reserve of forests and olive groves borders much of the lake making for a serene setting, especially since motorised boats are prohibited. You will enjoy a bit of free time in Trevignano Romano, one of the three main towns along the lakeshore. The elliptical Colosseum may well be the most recognisable Roman building from ancient times, and while pausing to snap photos of its exterior you will hear about the amphitheatre's notorious past as a venue for everything from gladiatorial games to public executions. A few steps away, you will find Palatine Hill, home to numerous imperial palaces, the first being the 1st-century Domus Tiberiana. This palace complex includes residential quarters, places of worship and rooms for the guards that protected the emperor. You will also visit the nearby Roman Forum, the centre of ancient life in Rome. There, emperors were crowned, elections were held and speeches were given that changed the course of the empire. The cruise will begin in Capodimonte, one of many picturesque villages tucked along the shores of Lake Bolsena. As the boat motors across the shimmering lake, you will pass olive groves, vineyards and dense forests. The two islands near the centre of the lake are Martana and the larger Bisentina, both privately owned and almost entirely covered in Mediterranean scrub and oaks. Several Renaissance-era stone chapels can be seen rising above Bosentina's tree line. The lakefront town of Bolsena is known for a miracle said to have occurred there during Mass at the tomb of St. Christina in the 13th century, a subject that the famed Renaissance painter Raphael captured in a fresco. Following the cruise, you will dine at a winery and sample several wines made from grapes that flourish along the lake. Enjoy a lovely drive through the inspiring Tuscan countryside to Florence, a city straddling the Arno River and home to countless masterpieces in its UNESCO World Heritage site historic centre. Visit the Galleria dell'Accademia, where Michelangelo's iconic David, carved from a single piece of marble, keeps eternal watch over myriad masterworks. You'll admire from outside the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, also known as Il Duomo, begun in 1296 and crowned with a superb octagonal cupola designed by the Renaissance architect Brunelleschi. Nearby you'll find the painter Giotto's soaring 14th-century campanile, or bell tower, and the Romanesque baptistery, which boasts stunning bronze doors by Ghiberti that are known as the Gates of Paradise. Marvel at Basilica di Santa Croce, Italy's largest and most renowned Franciscan Gothic church, where many of Italy's illustrious citizens are entombed, including Michelangelo, Galileo, Rossini and Machiavelli. Learn that one of the church's most prized works of art is Donatello's Annunciation, a moving sculpture in carved and gilded stone. Appreciate generous time for additional exploration and let magical Florence serve as your muse.	Drop off in Florence: approx. 45 mins walk each way. Journey through the countryside of the famed Chianti region to Siena, a gorgeous medieval city whose warren of narrow Gothic streets, lined with palaces and patrician mansions, converge on the uniquely shell-shaped Piazza del Campo. You'll appreciate the city's cathedral, which is Siena's highest point and a stunning conglomeration of Romanesque and Gothic styles. Settle in for a brief drive to iconic San Gimignano, famed for its striking medieval towers, and enjoy free time to lunch. Tour the lovely 14th-century Palazzo del Popolo, dominated by a tall tower with a wonderful, panoramic view of town and the nearby Palazzo Vecchio del Podestà. You'll see this 13th-century palace boasts an expansive portico on the ground floor and its own magnificent tower. Appreciate time at your leisure to roam San Gimignano's evocative streets, perhaps stopping for a cooling gelato in one of the welcoming cafés scattered throughout this fairytale town. Pass through the classic Tuscan countryside during your coach ride to Florence, where a walking tour of the pedestrianised historical centre, a UNESCO World Heritage site, will reveal the wonders engendered by the city's centuries-long patronage by the Medicis. Admire the bravura complex of the Cathedral of Santa Maria dei Fiore, whose famed dome by Brunelleschi rises above Florence. See priceless masterpieces complementing the building, including sculptures by Donatello gracing Giotto's tour de force, the 14th-century campanile, or bell tower.</p> <p>After time for lunch on your own, continue to Pisa for a self-guided tour around the Campo dei Miracoli, or Field of Miracles, a UNESCO World Heritage site home to medieval architectural masterpieces. Discover the beloved Leaning Tower, listing due to the unstable soil found beneath the Campo dei Miracoli, and the outstanding duomo, or cathedral, whose multi-level colonnades and subtle interplay of marble and stone make it the archetype of the Pisan Romanesque style. Enter the elaborate circular baptistery, acclaimed for its outstanding acoustics, another mesmerising highlight on your enlightening survey of Tuscany's glittering gems.</p>	This tour is not considered suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair or guests with mobility concerns. An official guide will be on board the coach and will provide some information and maps. Ascending the tower in Pisa is not included in the tour as timing restrictions make this difficult to incorporate. The order of the tour can be reversed but always covering the same sites, therefore it is not recommended to book museum entrances or private visits. The tour busses are not allowed into the historical centre of Florence and cannot reach the Miracle Square of Pisa. Drop on Florence: 40-45 mins walk each way.
