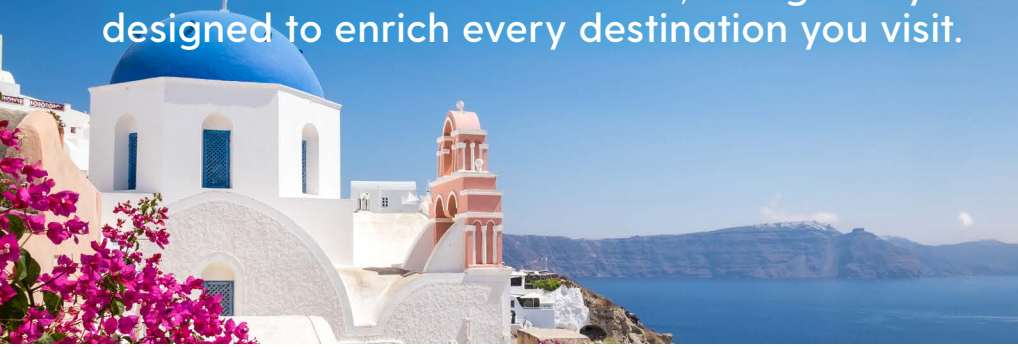

Visit the Delphi Archeological Museum to see the Omphalos, a rounded stone indicating the navel of the world, and the stunning 5th-century BC bronze Charioteer, one of the best-known statues from Classical Greece. | Piraeus (Athens) - Embarkation | Greece | PIR-025 | Active | RAILBIKE ADVENTURE | \$179 | 4.75 | STRENUOUS | Pedal a two-person railbike along the tracks of a now inactive railway while admiring the extraordinary natural beauty around Megara on the outskirts of Athens. Draisines – more commonly known as railbikes – were invented in the mid-1850s to transport railway workers so they could easily inspect and repair the tracks. Today, these pedal-powered vehicles offer a fun and unusual way to ride the rails. In all, you will travel about 2.5 miles with stops along the way to rest and to ramble around historical attractions that include stone-and-concrete artillery bunkers that the Germans built during World War II. You will pedal atop cliffs overlooking the glistening Saronic Gulf, through a former railway tunnel and across a trestle bridge. The guide will provide enlightening and entertaining commentary the entire time, which will make the adventure all the more memorable. You may even hear harrowing tales of the robber Sciron, a local figure from Greek mythology. | Participants must be at least 15 years of age, weigh no more than 220 lbs and have a minimum height of 4 ft 9 inches. Tour involves enough amount of biking and it is suggested that guests wear comfortable clothing, have any medication needed with them in case of any allergies, have water or isotonic drink with them if they wish. Helmets are provided. The rail biking tour covers a distance of 7 km, and on the way back, riders will cover a total of 14 km. The initial part of the journey involves a slight uphill, and riders will have to make a little effort. However, after the first stop, cycling will become more comfortable. Descend into the intriguing Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa, Alexandria's largest Roman cemetery, where more than 300 souls were interred, and discover splendid sculptures and reliefs of Egyptian gods crafted in a Roman style. Wonder at towering Pompey's Pillar, an astounding 82-foot-tall red Aswan granite column constructed to honour the powerful emperor Diocletian and the largest Roman triumphal monolith outside the imperial capitals of Rome and Constantinople. You'll learn it was erroneously named after the Roman general Pompey, who was thought to have been buried here after his murder on the orders of Egypt's King Ptolemy. Applaud the captivating 4th-century Roman amphitheatre, unearthed in 1960, where up to 800 spectators thrilled to musical performances, and admire its well-preserved white marble steps and mosaic flooring. You'll uncover the imprint of the Roman Empire on enthralling Alexandria, a city at the crossroads of two powerful ancient civilisations. | This tour includes approximately 45 minutes of moderate walking/standing. There will be uneven surfaces and numerous steps to negotiate. The tour is not recommended for guests who utilise a wheelchair or guests with mobility concerns. | Alexandria | Egypt | ALX-002 | Highlights | ALEXANDRIA MUSEUM AND LIBRARY | \$159 | 4 | EASY | Treasure Egypt's rich and alluring history during revealing visits to the new Library of Alexandria and the comprehensive National Museum. Study over 1,800 pharaonic, Greco-Roman, Islamic and Coptic artifacts at the Alexandria National Museum, which is located in a restored early 20th-century palace. As you roam its three floors, you'll discover a fascinating selection of invaluable items, including artifacts rescued from the depths of the Mediterranean Sea. Visit the remains of the illustrious Library of Alexandria, once a vast repository of knowledge and centre for learning and scholarly research, originally founded in the 3rd century BC by Ptolemy I Soter and partially destroyed in 48 BC due to a fire ignited by Julius Caesar's troops. At the sophisticated new library, the Bibliotheca Alexandrina, learn that its design was conceived through cooperation between Egypt and UNESCO to pay tribute to the original, and admire the bold architecture featuring a massive circular structure with a tilting roof. Enjoy a walking tour of the new library's elegant grounds, which are also home to an absorbing museum, galleries and planetarium, and celebrate Alexandria's renaissance as the global cultural centre it was always destined to be. | This tour includes approximately 2 ½ hours of moderate walking/standing. There will be some steps to negotiate. Guests with mobility concerns are cautioned to evaluate their personal level of ability and stamina. In cases where the library is closed, a photo stop will be made and we will include a visit of the Quait bay Citadel.
