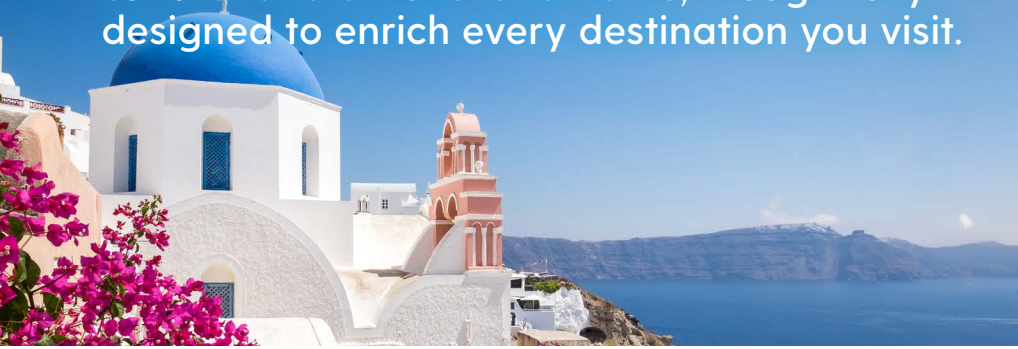

The route will take you past Buckingham Palace and St. Paul's Cathedral on the way to the imposing Tower of London. One of the most famous fortified buildings in the world, the Tower was built by order of William the Conqueror. It has served as a palace, prison, treasury, arsenal and even a zoo, and today it houses the priceless crown jewels. Also on view are the Medieval Palace, the infamous Bloody Tower and over 90 inscriptions made by prisoners in the Beauchamp Tower. Following free time for lunch in Central London, you will continue the panoramic sightseeing tour, passing some of the city's most important and royal monuments such as Westminster Abbey, Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament and London Bridge. The river cruise will offer a unique water perspective of landmarks such as the Houses of Parliament, an extraordinarily beautiful building also known as the Palace of Westminster. French Impressionist Claude Monet famously painted the Parliament at different times of the day from the same Thames perspective that the cruise offers. Following lunch on shore, you will begin the panoramic driving portion of the tour. The exact route will depend on the traffic, but you can expect to see highlights such as Buckingham Palace, Big Ben and St. Paul's Cathedral. The exact route will depend on the traffic and time of day, but you can expect to see Trafalgar Square, home of the imposing Nelson's Column, and pass through Admiralty Arch and into The Mall. It will be quite a sight as Buckingham Palace stands at the far end and the delightful oasis St. James' Park beckons to the side. Nearby, you will see Whitehall with its poignant Cenotaph war memorial. You can also count on exploring the square mile of the old city, whose medieval and Georgian atmospheres still survive. You will soon gain an overall impression of London through icons such as Buckingham Palace, the official residence of her Majesty the Queen, and Westminster Abbey, scene of coronations and state ceremonies for centuries. Depending on the traffic, you will pause for photos of famed locales such as the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben, which rises above its north end. The baths also contributed to UNESCO declaring the city a World Heritage site. Bath's other notable features include a wealth of stately, honey-coloured Georgian architecture and its location in the quintessentially English rolling countryside. Although it will take about two hours to reach Bath, it will be well worth the time. Besides exploring the famed bath complex, which was founded in 75 AD, you will visit Pulteney Bridge, one of few such structures in the world with shops along both sides of its span. Designed in 1769 with pilasters and domes at both ends, the bridge is an architectural gem. You will also spend time along the Royal Crescent, one of the finest examples of Georgian architecture in England, before enjoying free time to explore further on your own. You will see the lofty spire of Salisbury's 13th-century cathedral long before arriving in town. Inside, you will find a remarkable range of historical items, including the oldest working clock in Britain and an original copy of the Magna Carta signed at Runnymede in 1215. Being perhaps the most well-known prehistoric site in England, Stonehenge is equally intriguing. Although built in three stages, the iconic stone circle that now stands at Stonehenge was constructed about 2500 BC in the late Neolithic period. UNESCO declared Stonehenge a World Heritage site for being the world's most architecturally sophisticated prehistoric stone circle. Its massive stones were transported as far as 150 miles and erected using precise interlocking joints. Exactly how Stonehenge was constructed and its ultimate purpose are not completely understood, but the guide will offer theories. Winchester Cathedral is one of Europe's largest cathedrals and is the lengthiest Gothic cathedral on the continent. Highlights include the elaborate carvings in the magnificent choir area and the Winchester Bible, the largest and finest of all surviving 12th-century English bibles. You may also view the simple gravestone of novelist Jane Austen, who lived in nearby Chawton. Continuing on, you will see the remains of Winchester Castle, specifically its Great Hall from the 13th century. Now a museum, the Great Hall displays a replica of the round table where King Arthur and his knights supposedly congregated. The table hangs on the wall and dates to medieval times, although King Henry VIII later had it decorated with a Tudor rose at its centre. Southampton	United Kingdom	SOU-013	Highlights	BLAST FROM THE PAST	\$209	4.75	MODERATE	View hundreds of the world's fastest, rarest and most revolutionary automobiles and other motorized vehicles at the Beaulieu National Motor Museum. There is so much to see and do that you don't have to be an car buff to find something to your liking. You might come across a Karl Benz-produced 1898 Velo, Triumph motorcycles, a replica of the magical flying car from the movie "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang" and a 1927 Sunbeam built specifically to shatter the land speed record – which it did. You can concentrate on one aspect of motoring such as cars of the Edwardian Era or take a wider approach and browse all sorts of different collections. The museum contains thousands of historical photos, blueprints for prototypes and unusual memorabilia ranging from petrol pumps to coiled bulb horns. There is even a talking crash-test dummy that will describe how safety features have evolved over time. Outside the museum, step into Palace House, the elegant ancestral home of the Montagu family. Wander through its richly decorated Victorian rooms and chat with costumed guides who bring the 19th century to life. Nearby, discover the peaceful Beaulieu Abbey, founded by Cistercian monks in the 13th century, with atmospheric ruins and an exhibition on monastic life. You can also ride England's oldest monorail, glide through the treetops on the Skytrain, or enjoy tranquil walks through the extensive landscaped gardens and grounds. This tour is Escorted not guided.	Wheelchair passengers must be able to board the motorcoach and have an able-bodied companion to assist them. Beaulieu offers good accessibility across much of the estate. The National Motor Museum is fully accessible via ramps and lifts, while the ground floor of Palace House can be accessed by wheelchair users, with visual guides available for the upper rooms. The lower levels of Beaulieu Abbey are also accessible, though the upstairs Domus exhibition is only reachable by stairs; an image book is provided as an alternative. Please note the Skytrain monorail is not wheelchair accessible, and while most pathways between attractions are suitable for wheelchairs, some garden and riverside paths may be uneven or gravel surfaced.

As you approach, you can't help but notice the Emirates Spinnaker Tower soaring above the quays. The tower design represents sails billowing in the wind, so it perfectly sets the stage for a deep dive into England's naval history. The collection of historic ships along the waterfront tells that story in vivid detail. As you step aboard HMS Victory, you will learn about her most famous role as the flagship of Admiral Horatio Nelson in the 1805 Battle of Trafalgar. More than two and a half centuries earlier, Henry VIII's flagship Mary Rose sank during the Battle of the Solent and rested on the bottom of the sea until it was salvaged in 1982. You will see the ship's remains and thousands of Tudor artifacts in the museum that now holds her.	HMS Victory features stepped stairs, rope bannisters, low ceilings, narrow and low doorways, low lighting, and uneven floors. The upper decks can become slippery when wet, so caution is advised. Wheelchair access is available to the Lower Gun Deck. The Mary Rose Museum has low light levels, which some visitors may find challenging. Southampton	United Kingdom	SOU-015	Highlights	THE D-DAY STORY	\$169	4.25	EASY	Gain a greater understanding of D-Day through imagery, military equipment and personal effects that bring the story to life like never before. While history books detail much of this dramatic World War II invasion, only the D-Day Story museum presents the event from the perspective of the people that experienced it. As you browse the collection of artifacts, you will realise the enormous scale of the operation, from its planning stages through the legacy of D-Day. This Allied invasion ultimately liberated Western Europe, but it greatly affected everyone involved as you will discover through their own heartfelt words and personal stories. The thousands of items on display include everything from flame-throwing tanks to photos with handwritten notes that reveal what the soldiers were thinking. The exhibits will evoke a range of emotions by shedding new light on D-Day. Later, you will pause for photos of Southsea Castle, a fortification that Henry VIII built to defend the English coast. At the old harbour, you'll admire the fortified Belém Tower, a welcome sight for hardy sea-going voyagers upon their return to Portugal after months at sea. Marvel at the magnificent Gothic Jerónimos Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage site built to commemorate the explorer's adventures and considered the most elaborate expression of the Manueline style, a unique form of decoration punctuated with marine symbols such as ropes, shells and coral. You'll appreciate a photo stop at the Alto do Parque Belvedere overlook high above Lisbon. Learn how Óbidos became a perpetual wedding gift from kings to their queens since 1298, when King Dinis presented the town to his young bride after she noted that the ramparts around it twined "like a ribbon around a bouquet of shining white houses." Begin a guided walking tour through narrow lanes with colourfully accented homes, and have a exterior visit the 17th-century Santa Maria parish church, featuring walls adorned with beautiful blue-and-white azulejos tiles. You'll relish time on your own at Pillory Square, which is anchored by a monument given to local fishermen in 1492 by Queen Leonor to honour her son but which was later used to punish criminals. Perhaps you'll choose to relax in a quaint outdoor café, browse inviting shops, hike up to the castle that is now a hotel, or explore the old lookout path on top of the wall encircling the city to conclude your unique, off-the-beaten-path experience. You'll learn from your guide that the apparitions began in 1917 and continued for six months until the last occurrence, when 70,000 believers joined the children at the site and declared they had witnessed the miracle of the sun "dancing" in the sky. Marvel at how the modest shrine that was first installed there has grown to include a massive basilica, a sanctuary and a huge main square, which hosts millions of Marian pilgrims and tourists from around the world. Take advantage of free time to explore the sprawling basilica, gaze at its 213-foot tower and visit the exact site of the apparitions, now a chapel marked by a marble pillar with a statue of the Virgin Mary. You might also wish to examine a piece of the Berlin Wall in the sanctuary, which represents the power of prayer, and contemplate the spiritual influence that wrought so many profound changes.
