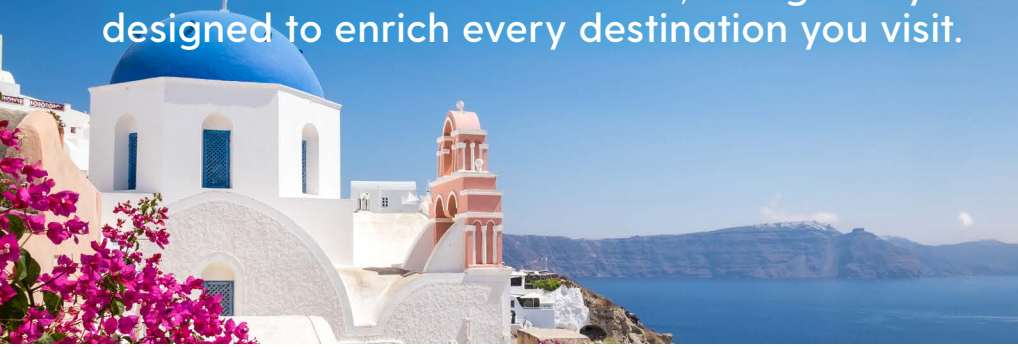

On the tony boulevard Passeig de Gràcia, drive past a feast of elegant buildings including astounding early 20th-century creations by idiosyncratic architect Antoni Gaudí, now UNESCO World Heritage sites. Pause at Gaudí's unfinished masterpiece, the Sagrada Família, a colossal basilica begun in 1883 and another UNESCO World Heritage site that epitomizes its creator's visionary style. You'll rejoice in the basilica's cacophony of twisting columns, fanciful spires and stained-glass windows, architectural miracles conjured by Gaudí and his successors. Back on your coach, drive through charming neighbourhoods before ascending Montjuïc, a picturesque hill and key site during the 1992 Olympics. Alighting at a well-placed lookout, you'll discover terrific views of Barcelona and its harbour, the city's many marvels spread out before you. At the Gothic quarter, enjoy some free time for independent exploration and strolling its narrow streets and handsome squares, lined with medieval buildings, and scattered about with remnants of walls and other constructions from an earlier Roman city. Relax during a vista-filled drive through a hilly and then mountainous country landscape to the Montserrat Range, a dramatic chain of serrated limestone mountains. After approximately ninety minutes, you'll reach the base of the mountain and then will embark a panoramic-glassed rackrail train to reach the monastery, which is nestled beneath extraordinary rock formations that evoke upright loaves of bread. Upon arrival, watch an introductory film depicting a monk's typical day and indulge in a taste of the monastery's traditional liqueur. Step into the monastery's centrepiece, the ornate basilica, whose highlight is a venerated wooden, dark-skinned statue of the Virgin that has attracted pilgrims since the 12th century. At the conclusion of your tour, enjoy time on your own, perhaps browsing the monastery's enticing shop or taking in sweeping views of the striking mountain scenery. Departing from pier, your immersion into Barcelona's history will be immediate with a pass by the Columbus Monument and the Old Port, while on your way to the Arc de Triomf and the Ciutadella Park; both part of the legacy from the 1888 World Exhibition and, the latter, once the garrison that protected the city.  Stop at Torre Glories, a beautifully bullet shaped skyscraper located in the technological district of Barcelona. Take a spacious lift to the 30th floor and admire the breath taking views from the new vantage point: see the main iconic landmarks of the city from the distance, including Sagrada Família, the W Barcelona hotel, the Collserola Natural Park and, of course, the sea promenade. Heading back into town, your coach will proceed through Marina avenue towards Diagonal until reaching the world-famous boulevard of Passeig de Gràcia. Continue on through the city's oldest path, Via Laietana, and enjoy a drive through Plaça Espanya, the Fair and Congress Palace, and Maria Cristina Avenue en route to Montjuïc Hill. Relax during a leisurely drive through the countryside past windmills and farms to the spellbinding Coves del Drach, a series of spacious interconnected caverns of otherworldly ambience. You'll wander among unusual formations with fanciful names like the Fairies' Theater and Diana's Bath, and learn that the cave's massive stalactites and stalagmites have grown a mere half-inch since being fully explored in the 1880s, a testament to the prehistoric age of the caverns. Discover one of the world's largest subterranean lakes, Llac Martel, which shimmers supernaturally due to strategically placed lights shining from above. Back above ground, tour a traditional Majorcan imitation pearl factory and gain invaluable insight into the manufacture of these coveted ornaments, which are crafted from natural marine products and are nearly indistinguishable from the real thing. Road closures or traffic changes without prior notice are conceivable. Weight restrictions can be applied for guests weighing more than 118Kg (260lbs). Marathons and other events may take place on Sundays, and as a result, traffic in Lisbon may be blocked at Belem, along the riverbank, across the 25 de Abril bridge, and/or down the Marginal all the way to Cascais.
