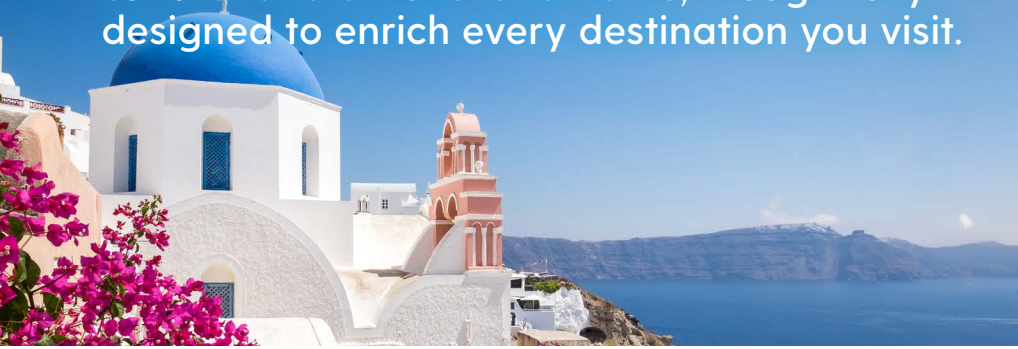

After cruising to the island, you will follow a stepped path to the Elephanta Caves, which hold a collection of shrines, courtyards and grand halls filled with exquisite stone sculptures and reliefs of Hindu gods and goddesses. All of them were carved in the 6th century, a feat so spectacular that UNESCO has deemed the caves a World Heritage site. The Portuguese, who ruled this area for about 200 years starting in the 16th century, named the island Elephanta for a large stone elephant statue found near the shore. Unfortunately, the Portuguese destroyed many of the sacred statues inside by using them for target practice. Even so, the sublime beauty of the caves remains and they still resonate with spiritual energy.	This tour includes a short walk and climbing numerous steps. You will also see a pink sandstone temple for a sect that supposedly represents the purest form of Hinduism. For a general glimpse into religion, you will pass Haji Ali mosque, which welcomes worshippers of all faiths. You may see others practicing Zoroastrianism, a pre-Islamic religion of Iran, in an unusual temple where a perpetual fire burns as part of the rituals. The Jewish influence is also substantial in Mumbai, as you will discover by visiting a synagogue that a family of philanthropists built in the 19th century. You will also have the opportunity to browse the 18th-century, Anglican-built St. Thomas Cathedral. It features a Gothic tower and elegant fountain that an eminent English architect designed. Mumbai	India	MUM-004	Highlights	JEWISH CHRONICLES OF INDIA	\$109	5	MODERATE	Gain insight into the history and development of the Jewish community in India, by visiting various synagogues and monuments. Your first stop will be the Gate of Mercy synagogue, a tiny unadorned building that is the oldest synagogue in Mumbai. The Victorian-style Magen David Synagogue presents quite a contrast, as it is fronted by pillars and is quite ornate. As more Jews came to India toward the end of the 19th century, Tifereth Synagogue was built nearby to accommodate them. You will also visit Keneseth Eliyahoo, which many consider to be the most beautiful synagogue in the city. As you will discover, the interior is as marvellous as its stone-and-brick exterior. It features decorated pillars, carved marble and a magnificent stained-glass arch rising to the high ceiling.	This tour includes about three hours of moderate walking with some steps. Atop Malabar Hill, you will find Bubulnath, an 18th-century Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva. As you will discover over tea with famed fashion designer James Ferreira at his home in Khotachiwadi, the village is known for its Portuguese-style wooden mansions and long association with the arts. One of the draws of Churchgate railway station will be watching the dabbawallahs busily sorting countless tiffin lunch boxes for delivery to Mumbai's work force. Following photo stops at two landmarks – the arched Gateway of India and the Taj Mahal Palace Hotel – you will dine at the equally iconic Khyber restaurant, an institution in the city. Another historical perspective will present itself at a 150-year-old mansion decorated with period furnishings, where you will watch a sari-tying demonstration. The best way to become immersed in the ambiance is to mingle with the locals, an experience you will enjoy at a market in the Pydnonie neighbourhood that is even more energetic at night. You will then drive past some of Mumbai's most iconic buildings that look wonderfully enchanting when illuminated. You will also travel down Marine Drive, a thoroughfare referred to as the Queen's Necklace because it sparkles with thousands of lights once night falls. Your immersion into the lifestyle will begin at a bustling bazaar that offers most everything imaginable for sale. You will watch as your hostess haggles with vendors and purchases the garden-fresh items she typically needs for the day. On the ride to her home, you will share the road with rickshaws, motorbikes and even cows as you proceed into Bandra, a now posh residential area that the Portuguese founded in the 1700s. While enjoying a home-cooked meal of traditional Anglo-Indian dishes in her residence, you can expect the conversation with your hostess to be lively and candid. You can expect it to be an emotionally moving ceremony that will set the tone for the day. Next, you will visit the Banganga, an ancient sacred water tank that Hindus believe has healing abilities. Your immersion into the lifestyle will begin at Moodushedde, a tribal village where you can observe artisans such as blacksmiths, potters, carvers and weavers. You will also visit an elaborately ornate guthu, a traditional house of the coastal landowners. For a more intimate glimpse into rural life, you will stop at a private home to enjoy the hospitality of a Mangalorean family that have lived there for generations. Expect to be wonderfully surprised by the interior of the St. Aloysius Chapel, a 19th-century landmark that was built to resemble the famed Sistine Chapel. Many of the frescoes and ceiling paintings celebrate the life of Saint Aloysius Gonzaga. You will also browse the spectacularly ornate Hindu temple Gokarnanath, which is dedicated to a form of Lord Shiva. An 8-foot-tall statue of Gokarnanath stands inside. Karkala is a historically important pilgrimage centre for the followers of the ancient religion Jainism and is famous for its statue of Lord Gomateshwara. Aside from the statue being of a colossal size, it is rendered even more striking by its location atop a huge granite rock, recognised for having the oldest known inscriptions in the Marathi language on it. For a change of pace, you will then visit a farm that uses innovative agricultural techniques such as multi-storied mixed cropping to grow tropical fruits and spices. A stop at the Thousand Pillars Temple in Moodbidri follows, during which you will browse the large, ornate Jain temple. Besides its abundant elaborately carved pillars, it contains a sacred bronze image of Lord Chandranatha Swami. You will then have the opportunity to meet the affluent Peres family in their private colonial-style home surrounded by manicured tropical gardens.
