Sports play a huge role in Los Angeles, as you will discover by passing the Coliseum, which has hosted two Olympics. You will also see the Staples centre, the home of the L.A. Lakers, Clippers and Kings, and usually the site for the Grammy awards. Still, no tour of Los Angeles is complete without visiting locales such as The Music centre, a complex that includes the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion and Walt Disney Concert Hall, and the Hollywood Walk of Fame at the TLC Chinese Theatre. As you stroll past the terrazzo and brass stars embedded in the sidewalk, you will recognise the names of celebrities ranging from Gloria Swanson to Brad Pitt. Other highlights include the sprawling Farmers Market, which opened in 1934, and The Grove, an adjoining shopping district. After pausing for photos at Santa Monica beach, you will continue along the famed Pacific Coast Highway to the Getty Villa, where more than a thousand Greek, Roman and Etruscan antiquities are on display. The museum is modelled on a 1st-century Roman villa discovered near Herculaneum, the Italian town that was destroyed along with Pompeii when Mt. Vesuvius erupted in 79 AD. The collection of antiquities ranges from ancient drinking vessels and clay figurines to classical Greek and Roman statuary, art objects and jewellery. The museum also houses rare manuscripts, drawings, paintings and decorative arts. But not all the treasures lie inside. The grounds feature an aromatic garden of herbs used by the ancient Romans, reflecting pools, ornate fountains and covered walkways leading to spectacular views of the Pacific Ocean. One of California's earliest incorporated cities, Laguna Beach has fiercely preserved its natural beauty, passionately promoted the arts and developed a village-like atmosphere, especially along the streets that end by the waterfront at Main Beach Park. As you will discover from this vantage point, it's an excellent spot to see the famed Hollywood sign. Inside, you will browse intriguing exhibits that prompt you to ponder your own relationship with the universe. The exhibits in the nearby California Science centre will be equally provocative, especially the area devoted to the retired space shuttle endeavour. Following a short video that describes the 25 missions of the space shuttle and its commanders, you will view some of its artifacts, including an external fuel tank, before seeing the endeavour up close. You will set off right from the pier in a caravan of vehicles and head north into the beautifully rugged countryside. While driving through the ever-changing terrain, you can expect to see distant mountains, idyllic valleys and sprawling farms. More than three-quarters of Mexico's wines are produced in the Guadalupe Valley, which enjoys a Mediterranean microclimate, constant ocean breezes and cool summers. In time, you will arrive at the acclaimed Monte Xanic winery, a low-volume winery where the grapes are handpicked at night, pressed, fermented and aged in French oak barrels. Monte Xanic produces more than a dozen wines under four different labels, several of which you will sample. During the drive inland, you will notice the terrain becoming hillier with an abundance of sprawling farms and idyllic valleys such as Guadalupe. The deeper you hike into El Salto canyon, the more dramatic the terrain. The walls will become so steep in places that not even the midday sun will reach the bottom of the canyon. El Salto, which means The Jump, is strewn with massive boulders, and at times you must hop from one to another to make your way along the trail. The difficulty of the route will make the hike all the more rewarding. To enhance the adventure, the guide will elaborate on the geological formation of this black-rock canyon and whatever wildlife you may come across. Birds such as red-tailed hawks and Western kingbirds are often spotted. On the way there, you may well spot dolphins frolicking in the ocean, a variety of sea birds and most likely surfers riding the waves as you approach the rugged coastline. After dropping anchor not far offshore, you will have the chance to snorkel in one of the sheltered coves. The Pacific waters in this area are teeming with marine life, and you can expect to see all sorts of colorful tropical fish. Many of them live in the kelp forest beneath the surface, including the garibaldi, a bright orange fish that is California's official state fish. You may also view mantas and eagle rays gracefully swimming by and lobsters and sea stars on the ocean floor. Following your snorkeling adventure, drinks and fresh fruit will be served back on board. A brief introduction to the estate will set the stage for the performance to follow, but nothing quite compares to watching it in person from a front-row seat. Dancing horse shows are thought to have originated in the court of Imperial China in the 3rd century B.C. and have since spread throughout the world. In this case, the horses are trained to "dance" to a traditional Mexican beat in a beautifully choreographed and dramatic fashion that will leave you mesmerized by their abilities. The accompanying music is an essential part of the pageantry as the horses are trained to respond to it. Dancing horse performances are often reserved for parades and fairs, which makes this exclusive show all the more special. While driving through town, you will see many of its highlights, but none is quite so historical and prestigious as the former Hotel Riviera del Pacifico. This rambling Spanish-style resort was built in 1930 and originally held a casino that Al Capone supposedly frequented. Upon arriving, you will be greeted by a mariachi band dressed in colorful costumes that will serenade you with songs that reflect the region's roots. As an accompaniment, you will be served a margarita, an iconic Mexican beverage that is said to have been invented at the hotel. In time, you will settle in for an authentic folkloric performance that is sure to be memorable. Free time follows, during which you may take pictures with the band, shop for handicrafts and see the ballroom where Bing Crosby and Xavier Cugat once performed. The ocean waves rush in so fast and furiously that the water forced through the blowhole can easily spew as high as 100 feet in the air. An experience of a different sort awaits you at the former Hotel Riviera del Pacifico, a landmark resort and casino from the 1930s that has been meticulously restored and converted into a cultural hub. After being serenaded by a mariachi band in full costume, you will be treated to a performance of traditional songs and dances associated with the region. While riding through El Cielo's vineyards in a truck, you will learn about the terroir and how the grapes are grown, harvested and processed using cutting-edge equipment to produce an array of award-winning wines. Some are varietals, others are blends. This insider's tour differs from most because you will sample the wines while traveling through the vineyards. It makes the experience all the more relevant and enjoyable. The tasting may include a Sauvignon Blanc with tropical flavors, a complex red made entirely from Tempranillo grapes and a blend of Merlot and Grenache with notes of plum and blackberry.

Harris hawks are among the most social birds of prey and often congregate in groups of three or more. They are exceptional hunters and even hunt cooperatively with other hawks, which is why they are nicknamed the "wolves of the sky." El Cielo employs Harris hawks to patrol the vineyards and scare away the invading armies of birds that come to feast on the ripening grapes as they soften and plump with sweet sugar. Just flying over the vineyards is usually enough of a deterrent. If not, Harris hawks have razor-sharp talons and large hooked beaks that can instantly incapacitate persistent avian pests. Using falcons versus chemical repellants ties in perfectly with El Cielo's commitment to the environment. Following the falconry demonstration, you will be served a brunch-style meal

El Cielo couldn't be more scenic as it sprawls across the Guadalupe Valley, home to the vast majority of Mexico's wineries. You will travel through the vineyards in a four-person golf cart and see firsthand how the more than a dozen varieties of grapes are grown, harvested and processed. The production methods are as natural as possible, which is among the reasons that El Cielo was named the valley's first eco-responsible company. Although modern technology is used to produce the wines, solar power supplies the energy for everything at the winery. You will sample several of the premium wines during the picnic along with regional cheeses and bread. The pairings will reflect the farm-to-table culture that is flourishing in the valley.

You will pause to snap photos at landmarks that include the colorful Ensenada sign, the Tara statue that represents Mother Earth, the dramatic Fisherman's Monument and Bodegas de Santo Tomás, the oldest winery in Baja California. And that is just for starters. A brief but enlightening stop at the Regional History Museum will set the stage for another historical immersion at Ensenada's cultural center, which is housed in the former Hotel Riviera del Pacifico. After a briefing on how to safely operate the ATV, you will make a few practice runs to ensure that you maximize the experience. Then, off you will go into the valley. You can drive or simply ride along if you feel more comfortable as a passenger. Either way, it will be exhilarating as the ATV is open on the sides for unobstructed views. The buildings are so extraordinary that UNESCO declared Antigua a World Heritage site. It is also historically important, as the city was once the capital of Guatemala. As you will see while browsing the Jade Maya Museum and Factory, jade has long been mined in this area and made into exquisite jewelry. Craft beer has also become popular in Antigua, and you will enjoy samples of it at the Antigua Brewing Company. The beers will be paired with local specialties that complement the flavors of both. Be sure to look for wildlife, especially birds that find shelter in the thick mangroves. Upon arriving in the town of Camana Bay in the heart of Seven Mile Beach, you will be free to explore on your own.
