Ponder mystic Chinatown and the astounding setting of Mrs. Macquarie's Chair, carved from solid sandstone on the point of a peninsula in Sydney harbour. Travel into Sydney's most desirable residential enclaves, their shorelines fringed with sprawling mansions and tony apartment towers overlooking the everchanging armada of yachts and cruise boats plying the harbour waters. Gaze on Double Bay's trendy sidewalk cafés and boutiques, and be dazzled by Watson's Bay's skyline views. Stop for photos at Bondi Beach, the celebrated half-mile crescent that's half surfing mecca and half Sydneysider hangout. Its signature roof design reminiscent of billowing sails, Sydney Opera House was officially opened by Queen Elizabeth II herself in October 1973. Today, it remains a lesson in the timelessness of great architecture as well as a defining component of the Sydney skyline – and sports a UNESCO World Heritage designation to boot. On your guided tour, you'll gain behind-the-scenes insights on its history, design concept and current role within the city's cultural life. A visit out to the Gap at Watson's Bay promises breathtaking views of a different sort, these across the rocky headlands that together guard the entrance to Sydney harbour. Your camera – and eyes – will struggle to fully capture this signature locale. And another one awaits a bit further down the coast: Bondi Beach's half-mile crescent of sand and delightful shoreside eateries. This is a spot beloved by locals, tourists, surfers, strollers and seemingly everyone else. Sydney	Australia	SYD-003	Local Discovery	THE BLUE MOUNTAINS	\$269	8	STRENUOUS	Discover the beauty of the countryside outside Sydney as you head for the World Heritage splendor of the Blue Mountains. Headed west from the city, feel the echoes of excitement still reverberating as you pass the site of the 2000 Sydney Olympics at Homebush. Travel through small towns and bushlands that Sydneysiders escape to on weekends as you begin to climb into the Blues along a road once the trail of Australia's early explorers. Drink in panoramic views of an awe-inspiring Grand Canyon of giant rock formations and cascading waterfalls. Once up at the Blue Mountains lookout, spot the famous Three Sisters rock formation and bask in the breathtaking views all around you – of Jamieson Valley, Mount Solitary, Ruined Castle, Katoomba Falls and the Burrigorang Valley. Take a thrilling ride on the world's steepest perpendicular railway, dropping some 700 feet down into the valley. A brief walk at the bottom brings you to where the Scenicender cable car picks up for your return to the mountaintop. Lunch will be on your own in Leura or a similar township, with free time to browse the local handicraft and antique shops. And enjoy brief Sydney highlights drive on the return. Taronga is an Aboriginal word that means "beautiful view," an appropriate description as the zoo overlooks lovely Sydney Harbour. The sights within the zoo will be just as extraordinary as you will discover while following a zookeeper on an enlightening introductory tour and by exploring in depth on your own. If you wish to see indigenous wildlife such as koalas, dingoes and kangaroos, take the trail through the Nura Diya Australia habitat. Other areas showcase animals from lands such as Africa and Asia, including critically endangered species such as eastern bongos and Sumatran tigers. California sea lions and fur seals are but a few of the marine mammals that live in the Great Southern Oceans habitat. Native and exotic birds, amphibians and reptiles are also abundant throughout the zoo.	The amount of walking is at guest discretion, however those with mobility concerns are cautioned to evaluate their personal level of ability as to fully appreciate the experience there is some moderate walking, approximately 500m / 0,3 miles. Sydney	Australia	SYD-007	Active	SYDNEY BRIDGE CLIMB & THE ROCKS	\$469	4.5	STRENUOUS	Here's your chance to experience a once-in-a-lifetime thrill as you embark on a safe but scary climb up to the summit of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. Don't worry, organised climbs have been ascending the span for years now. Your local escort will walk you to BridgeClimb HQ, where you'll be given an extensive safety briefing, issued a special BridgeSuit to wear over your clothing, and outfitted with an all-important safety harness. Proceeding to the Climb simulator, your experienced Climb Leader will ensure that you're up to speed on ladder procedures and harness use. Then, set up with radio and headset for hearing your leader's commentary, it's time to get out there! During approximately two hours on the bridge, your group of 12 climbers will make its way over 4,900 feet of steel, weaving through catwalks and up ladders – all to reach the most spectacular part of all, the upper arch climb. As birds-eye views of Sydney Harbour and the city fully surround you, your Climb Leader will capture the "historic" moment on camera.	This tour is not available to wheelchair guests, pregnant women, or those with mobility concerns, heart problems, asthma, epilepsy, or recent back/neck injuries. It is also not recommended for those with a fear of heights. Guests must be physically fit and able to climb ladders and steep slopes. The actual bridge climb lasts some 2 hours and traverses nearly 5,000 feet of steps, catwalks, arches and ladders. The walk to and from The Rocks involves some uneven and cobblestone surfaces. No one under the influence of alcohol or drugs may participate. A breathalyzer test will be performed to each participant before the climb. A release form must be signed before taking part in the tour. Due to the nature of the climb, nothing may be carried with you onto the bridge; however, photo opportunities will be available during The Rocks walk. The Bridge Climb also required climbers aged 75 years or older to have a completed Certificate of Fitness signed by a Doctor. Anyone ages 75 years or older that does not have this certificate completed and signed will not be permitted to climb.

Depart the pier with your guide for a stroll along Circular Quay to The Rocks, Sydney's famous birthplace. In sharp contrast to the modern steel and glass skyscrapers of the city, The Rocks represents pure history. Upon arrival, you will hear informative commentary as your guide escorts you through this historic district past old pubs, terrace homes and sandstone cottages. Sites of crime, punishment and escape will be noted as you learn about the notorious personalities that have made Sydney what it is today. Cairns	Australia	CNS-001	Highlights	BUTTERFLY SANCTUARY & AUSSIE WILDLIFE	\$189	4	MODERATE	Enter an aviary fluttering with butterflies, mingle with free-roaming wallabies, and tour a colourful township nestled in the very heart of Tropical North Queensland. Just about a half-hour inland from Cairns is the mountain village of Kuranda, surrounded by World Heritage rainforest and sporting a frontier history dating back to the logging and mining heydays of the 1800s. Your brief orientation drive through town will reveal much charm and also a distinctly artsy modern character. At the Australian Butterfly Sanctuary, the art has wings – of every imaginable colour. This walk-in aviary is a naturally recreated habitat with a running stream and over 1,500 iridescent residents, including the electric blue Ulysses butterfly and yellow-green Cairns Birdwings. All are local rainforest species, and a few have surprisingly elaborate behaviours, including courtship dances and battles over territory. Shifting to another branch of the animal kingdom, you'll visit the Koala and Wildlife Sanctuary, where you can wander among kangaroos and wallabies, visit a curious nocturnal environment, and encounter that most adorable of Down Under icons, the koala. This truly memorable experience begins with a drive out of town to the Freshwater Railway Station, where you'll board the heritage Kuranda Scenic Railway for an incredible 90-minute journey, ascending 1,076 feet, passing magnificent waterfalls, transiting 15 tunnels and crossing 40 bridges as you traverse an ancient rainforest reserve. Arriving in colourful Kuranda, you'll head for Rainforestation nature park to be properly introduced to the jungle's flora and fauna as your Duck Captain splashes his amphibious vessel along the water's edge. After this immersive excursion, you'll be inspired to protect the rainforest more than ever. It's a short drive by coach to the starting station of the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway, a chain of see-through gondolas that glides over untamed Queensland terrain for nearly 5 miles – travelling just a few feet over the treetops. The immersive Skyrail journey provides an intimate sensory experience, where you can see, smell and become part of the tropical rainforest – one of the most botanically fascinating and diverse environments on earth. The cableway has two mid-stations where you can step off on the forest floor to learn more what you're seeing. Walkways at Barron Falls station lead to lookouts offering breathtaking views of Barron Gorge and its thundering cascades; a state-of-the-art Rainforest Interpretation centre is here as well. Your Skyrail journey ends in Kuranda, where you'll enjoy a brief overview drive of the town, then have time to take in its delightful colour independently. Established during Queensland's 1800s heydays of logging and mining, this was an outpost where you could stock up on goods and enjoy some culture and sophistication. It still is today.	This tour includes approximately 90 minutes of walking and standing, at times over uneven natural surfaces. There are some steps to negotiate and guests must step up to board Skyrail. A scenic 45 min ride by coach brings you to Rainforestation Nature Park, where you'll board an amphibious World War II Army Duck for a tour like no other. Piloting the vessel through the rainforest over land and water with equal ease, your Duck Captain will identify and explain fascinating plants and wildlife as you pass by. Don't be surprised to see scaly goannas soaking up the sun, a python slithering up a tree or eels swimming around the Duck. That rollicking ride is followed by a visit to the park's amphitheatre for a show performed by indigenous Pamagirri Aboriginal dancers who depict animals, food-gathering and hunting through spirited music and dance. Your adventure begins with a scenic 90-minute sail by luxury catamaran to the Marine World activity platform on one of the Outer Great Barrier Reef's most pristine and versatile sites. You'll enjoy about four hours on this floating resort, dividing your time among several inclusive activities that showcase this breathtaking environment. Perhaps you'll take a ride on the semi-submersible to observe the reef's intricate coral gardens and colourful fish without getting wet. Or slip into the inviting aquamarine water with provided snorkel and mask to explore the reef al fresco. Optional scuba diving and escorted snorkelling tours are also available at an extra charge. The comfortable Marine World platform has multiple decks with sun lounges up top, ample undercover seating, freshwater showers and changing rooms, and its own Underwater Reef Viewing Observatory.
