Laem Chabang (Bangkok)	Thailand	LCH-002	Highlights	THAILAND'S ANCIENT CAPITAL: AYUTTHAYA	\$259	10	STRENUOUS	Enjoy a glimpse into the past splendor of the Siamese kingdom by visiting the 14th-century city of Ayutthaya, an acclaimed World Heritage site. Founded in 1350, Ayutthaya remained the kingdom's capital until 1767, when the conquering Burmese destroyed it. As you tour the magnificent excavated ruins, you will behold a collection of towering spires known as prangs and begin to understand the significance of the city, which was once one of the world's largest, most cosmopolitan urban areas. Be sure to notice the city's rigid grid layout and the moats and canals around the principal structures. You will also find the Buddhist temples Wat Chaiwatthanaram and Wat Naphramen within the complex. The royal summer palace of Bang Pa-In lies nearby on an island in the middle of a lake. An excellent example of classic Thai architecture, it is one of the most photographed buildings in the kingdom.	This tour consists of extensive walking, at times over uneven ground. It is not considered suitable for wheelchair guests or those with mobility concerns. Revealing attire such as sleeveless shirts or blouses, shorts and slippers are not permitted inside the Bang Pa-In Summer Palace. The drive to and from Ayutthaya is about three hours. The tour duration may vary due to traffic conditions.
Laem Chabang (Bangkok)	Thailand	LCH-004	Highlights	WOOD PAVILLION AT SANCTUARY OF TRUTH	\$109	4.25	MODERATE	Experience the ancient beauty, tradition and art of Thailand by visiting the Wooden Pavilion at the mystical Sanctuary of Truth. This enormous, pagoda-shaped structure overlooking the Gulf of Thailand is made entirely of wood, using ancient methods of building. Not even one nail was used in its construction, which began in 1981 and continues today. Nearly every square inch of the Wooden Pavilion is covered with intricate hand-carved wooden sculptures that supposedly reflect the world's ancient knowledge. It is an amazing and emotionally moving sight, inside and out. While browsing the interior, you can expect to view the cavernous inner chapel, which reveals scenes from Chinese, Hindu and Buddhist traditions. Other highlights include a massive carving of the three-headed elephant god Erawan at the entrance and a towering central atrium. During the cruise, you will see houses on stilts, floating grocery stores and water taxis zipping about. Few experiences offer such a candid look at life on Bangkok's waterways. In time, you will arrive at Wat Arun, the glorious Temple of Dawn, whose main spire soars more than 200 feet into the air. A traditional Thai lunch follows, after which you will explore the Grand Palace, an extraordinary example of an ancient Siamese court. Thailand's kings lived here for more than 150 years, and today it is used primarily for royal ceremonies and state occasions. You will also visit the Emerald Buddha Temple within the palace complex. It holds a 14th-century statue of Buddha that was carved from a single piece of emerald-green jasper.	The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2½ hours. The tour involves a moderate amount of walking and pontoons to negotiate. Guests must be able to enter and exit the boats with limited assistance. The tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or who utilise a wheelchair. Shoes must be removed when entering temples. Construction began in the late 18th century during the reign of King Rama I, and it became one of the city's largest temples. Be sure to notice its beautiful roofline, golden Buddha and huge red teak arch, which is all that remains of its giant swing. The statues outside were supposedly ballast from rice boats that arrived from China. During a panoramic drive you will stop for lunch at a local hotel before continuing through Old Town. You will pass the massive Democracy Monument, which is dedicated to the ideals that led to Thailand becoming a democratic monarchy in 1932. This excursion also allows time for shopping for exquisite merchandise such as silk and jewellery.	The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2 ½ hours. Also known as Ancient Siam, the park sprawls over hundreds of acres full of temples, stupas and entire villages that represent different regions of Thailand. As you wind your way through the Ancient City on a tram, you will likely see countless images of Buddha, stone statues and a floating market surrounded by traditional houses that were saved from destruction in other parts of Thailand and reconstructed on site. The most outstanding structure is the reproduction of the Prasat Sanphet Palace, which was the principal palace during the Ayutthaya Period that lasted from the mid-14th to mid-18th centuries. The tram will stop on occasion, so you can approach the most interesting sites for a closer look.	The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2¼ hours. The tour involves about a mile of walking and some steps to negotiate. It is not available to wheelchair guests and those guests with mobility concerns should evaluate their stamina and ability before joining the tour.

As you cruise the city's always bustling Chao Phraya River, you will take in picturesque scenes of traditional life on the water. You can expect to see floating grocery stores, water taxis zipping about and teakwood houses built on stilts. In time, you will stop to browse the Royal Barge Museum, which houses the ornately decorated longboats that were once used for royal functions. You might also see a gold-encrusted swan-shaped barge used solely by the king. Wat Arun, known as the Temple of Dawn, will present yet another side of Bangkok, as it features a soaring tower-like spire that symbolises Mount Meru, which is supposedly the centre of the universe.	The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2 ½ hours. The tour involves about an hour of walking with some steps at Wat Arun. Pontoons must be crossed to embark the boats. Considered to be an extraordinary example of an ancient Siamese court, the palace was built in 1782 at the beginning of the Chakri Dynasty. The entire complex sprawls over nearly one square mile in the heart of Bangkok and served as the residence of Thailand's kings for 150 years. Within the palace compound, you will find the Temple of the Emerald Buddha, which holds a 14th-century statue of Buddha that was carved from a single piece of emerald-green jasper. The king of Thailand changes the Buddha's robes each season in an elaborate ritual, during which he also sprinkles water over the monks to bring good fortune. Be sure to notice the murals on the temple walls that depict the life of Buddha and steps to enlightenment.	The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2¼ hours. The tour involves about two hours of moderate to strenuous walking and standing with some steps to negotiate. The tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or guests who utilise a wheelchair. Shoes must be removed to enter the temple. Video and still cameras are allowed in the Royal Palace grounds and in the compound of the Emerald Buddha Temple, but not inside the buildings.

This fabulous show of lights, extravagant costumes, music and dance will be sure to entertain. Dubbed as “the greatest show in Asia” and “legend within the area” this show invites you to experience the wonder of a lifetime. Alcazar has a reputation of full satisfactions for its shows, and this show is no different. You will experience the magic of Alcazar’s state of the art lighting system, surround sound and of course, the lovely “Ladies” performing for their audience. An approximately 1-hour drive takes you to Pattaya. Entering the city, enjoy a short scenic drive passing some of its livelier areas. On arrival to the theatre, your guide will hand out your seating tickets and escort you into the grounds. Taking your seats, the lights will dim, and the show will begin. A performance of a lifetime will be presented by over 400 professional production crew members and a talented cast. The show lasts for approx. 70 minutes and involves up to 17 different acts including: The Wondrous World, Flowers of China, Hello Vietnam, Persian Dance, The World is Not Enough and The Four Legendary Regions of the Siam Kingdom. The pachyderms at the Elephant Jungle Sanctuary are treated respectfully in an environment where they are free to socialise, play and forage along the jungle trails. Unlike other captive elephants, they aren’t ridden and they don’t perform in shows. The elephant handlers, known as mahouts, will describe the natural behaviour of Asian elephants, a species that is smaller than African elephants. Don’t be surprised if you get wet and somewhat muddy while feeding the elephants, walking through the jungle with them and observing them bathing. Elephants are highly intelligent and communicate by touching and making sounds such as roars, rumbles and trumpets. They are also known to show emotions ranging from compassion to grief. Asian elephants are considered to be a bit sassy, which makes this experience all the more fun.	This tour includes approximately 2 hours of walking. The market is divided into four sections, each representing a different region of Thailand. Although just opened in 2008, the market looks much older as it was designed to replicate an ancient floating market, most of which have long been abandoned. During free time at the market, you might sample items such as dragon fruit and mangosteen—the national fruit of Thailand—and linger over a freshly prepared lunch that is characteristic of one of the four regions. With so many aromas enticingly wafting through the air, it will be hard to resist dining. But the floating market offers much more than food. You will also find unusual handicrafts, silverware, handmade bags and silk clothing. The atmosphere couldn’t be more inviting.

While it will take two hours to reach Chachoengsao, it will be well worth the effort. The Bang Pakong River supplies abundant water to the area, and rice especially flourishes there. As you will discover by browsing the century-old Klong Suan Market with the locals, every imaginable type of food is available. Best of all, many vendors offer samples. For an entirely different perspective of the area, you will visit Luang Pho Sothon, a temple with a revered statue of Buddha that according to legend was found floating down the river. Chances are, you will see worshippers praying for prosperity and others leaving offerings. Women often leave boiled eggs in hopes of becoming pregnant. While wandering about the temple, be sure to notice the artwork, especially the painted murals of religious scenes.

You will first visit Ang Sila, an engaging city revered for its hand-carved stoneware, especially granite mortars and pestles used for grinding spices. This prized piece of kitchenware is prevalent throughout Ang Sila, which means “stone basin.” Even so, fishing is the primary industry and most of the local seafood recipes call for spices—preferably ground with a stone mortar and pestle. Sticky rice is the iconic product associated with the Chon Buri province. Served as a signature dessert known as Khao Lam, sticky rice is typically mixed with coconut milk, black beans, sugar and salt before being roasted over an open fire in a stout bamboo tube. As you will discover firsthand at the Nong Mon Market, Khao Lam is a delicious treat any time of the day.	This tour includes approximately 2 hours of walking/standing. Although contemporary, the Big Buddha Temple is much more traditional, as its attractions are the namesake enormous statue of Buddha and a collection of huts for meditation.
